Juab County does an excellent job in caring for the finances of the county and received a "clean" audit opinion.

Denton Alexander and Jeremy Wilkey, both with Hawkins Cloward & Simister, represented the independent auditing firm and presented the annual audit to commissioners.

Hawkins Cloward & Simister of Orem, Utah, has changed its name to Hawkins. The firm's retirement plan division will be known as Hawkins Retirement. In conjunction with the name change, the company is launching a new branding campaign and corporate website, MyCPA.com.

Mangelsons selected as Grand Marshals for Levan Heritage Days

Golden and Irene Mangelson are life-long residents of Levan. They were both born in Levan. Golden was born on August 9, 1926 and Irene was born on November 17, 1926. They attended grade school in Levan and graduated from Juab High School. Golden was drafted into the US Army in February 1945, a few months before high school graduation. Irene waited for him and they were married on December 11, 1946. This year marks their 70th Wedding Anniversary.

While in the army, Golden served in a field artillery unit traveling to the Philippine Islands, and then onto Japan after the war. In Japan he disposed of Japanese implements of war. He also served as group leader of the LDS servicemen in the area. He has been a member of American Legion Post 24 since his service in WWII. Golden has taken many opportunities to serve the people of Levan and surrounding communities. He has served as a Levan Town Council member, Mayor, Juab County Commissioner, on the Six-County Board of Directors, member of the Governor's Advisory Council, and was a founding member of Utah Municipal Power Agency to name a few.
